MEMORANDUM FROM NITAAC GWAC PROGRAM OFFICE

SUBJECT: FEE REDUCTION AND CAP ON THE NIH CONTRACT ACCESS FEE (NCAF)

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB), encourages federal agencies to use Government Wide Acquisition Contracts (GWACs) to aggregate buying power and streamline the acquisition of Information Technology (IT) products and services. The NCAF reimburses the National Institutes of Health (NIH) for the cost of operating and administering its GWACs.

The NITAAC Program Office is pleased to announce that effective immediately, the NCAF has been reduced for all new Task/Delivery Order Requests (TORs) released on or after January 5, 2016. For CIO-SP3 the fee is reduced from 1% to .65% and CIO-SP3 Small Business from .75% to .55%. Further a cap of \$150,000 applies to any task order base or optional period (not to exceed 12 months) with funding in excess of \$23 million under the CIO-SP3, and \$27 million under the CIO-SP3 Small Business contracts (please see table below).
